

# Impact of Covid-19 on Light and Sound and Hire Goods Owners in Kannur District of Kerala

Abstract: The world has been experiencing a rare disaster of corona virus pandemic (Covid 19) since December 2019. Most of the countries in the world have been implementing quarantines and social distancing practices to contain the pandemic and implemented lockdown. The covid 19 has created a multiple crisis in several fronts: health, travel, economy, finance, production and output, employment and unemployment, prices, emigration and remittances, fiscal situation of etc. The lockdown implemented in the Kerala followed by covid outbreak has resulted in an unprecedented loss of employment in all sectors of the economy. Light and sound sector also in crisis. By cancelling functions and public events due to covid restriction, light and sound and hire goods workers lose their income. The main purpose of this study is to understand the adverse impact of corona in their income level and identify how they sustain life during lockdown. Thus, this study is entitled as, "impact of covid 19 on light and sound and hire goods owners" with special reference to Kannur district.

#### 1. Introduction

The first covid 19 case in India was reported in the Thrissur district of Kerala. Between January and May 2020, the rate of growth of covid 19 cases was very small. But during the month of July and August there has been a steep increase in the number of covid cases. The lockdown implemented in the state has resulted in an unprecedented loss of employment in all sectors of the economy. Due to the prolonged lockdown, guarantine, physical distancing and other isolation measures to suppress transmission of the Covid 19, state's economy is heading towards a recession. Non-essential services and production were directly affected by the lockdowns, which led among other things, to a reduction in the number of hours worked and to job losses. The impact of the lockdown was most severe in case of self-employed and casual workers in all sectors of the economy. Due to a curfew like situation, there was a total stop of almost all activities of an informal sector except the trade of essential goods and agricultural operations. They did not even get a modest income from their work during lockdown period. They had to resort to other means of employment to meet their daily expenses. #### 4. Research Methodology

The data was collected by conducting a survey among light and sound and hire goods owners in Kannur district. 30 respondents were selected for conducting the study. The primary data for the study were obtained from 30 respondents working in light and sound and hire goods business in Kannur district by using a structured questionnaire. Secondary data were collected through various sources such as newspapers and websites etc. Most of the secondary data is collected through internet. The study was conducted in January 2021.

## 5. Literature Review

'The hindu' reported that "the 50000-odd members affiliated to the Light and Sound Welfare Association of Kerala, which announcers, and 'pandal' workers, have got yet come out of the financial crisis induced by the pandemic. We have lost an estimated ₹25 crore in terms of revenue and earnings after the break out of covid 19, said Biju K V, general secretary of the association. Hundreds had to leave their jobs as festivals, marriages and stage events were suspended following the crisis. The association representatives pointed out that the Assembly elections may not bring major change in their earnings as it is confined to 140 Assembly constituencies compared with the opportunities available in times of the three tier local body elections." As per the report of Mathrubhumi, from the day coronavirus was confirmed the 'light and sound' sector is in crisis. With the festivals, public events and functions cancelled, the owners are on the run to arrange money to pay their labourers. January to June is viewed as the period of festivals and celebrations. But this time, within two weeks after confirming covid 19 in the state, 25 programmes have been cancelled. "

According to the report of Indian express, majority of persons working in Light and sound and hire goods business are

of the view the local body poll campaigning amid the strict restrictions will not enough for the sector, which has been remaining idle for the past seven months, to re-emerge. The livelihood of owners and staff has been severally affected. Many of the workers in this sector are now doing sale of vegetables and fish. The government has turned a blind eye towards this sector."

The summary of literature exposes those different studies were conducted in the area of impact of covid 19 on employment and economy. But no serious study was conducted emphasizing on light and sound and hire goods owners other than the reports stated above. This research gap was identified and that will be addressed in the present study.

## 6. Discussion

- 1. Majority of the respondents are Hire goods workers (56.7%) and 43.3 % of respondents are light and sound owners.
- 2. 20% of respondents have been working above 15 years in this field.
- 3. Out of 30 respondents, 50% are responded as they satisfied in their job. 20% was very satisfied and 30% was partially satisfied.
- 4. 96.7% of respondents agree that covid 19 caused heavy financial loss. Only 3.3% of respondents have opinion of corona doesn't affect financially.
- 5. Before covid 19, majority of respondents have the annual income of ₹ 50000 to ₹75000. But during the covid era, the annual income of all respondents was fall down.
- 6. Before covid 19, majority of respondents get 10 to 15 number of works per month, but during corona, the number of works per month decreased to below 10.
- 7. Majority of the respondents have their own shop (70%). Only 30% use shops for rent.
- 8. 55.5% are unable to pay the rent during lockdown.
- 9. 33.3% of total respondents does not paid salary to their employees during lockdown due to financial crisis.
- 10. After lockdown, the light and sound and hire goods owners make change in rate of payment to employees.

43.3% of respondents reduce salary by 25%, 30% reduce by 50% and 26.7% doesn't make any change in the salary to employees.

- 11. Out of 30 samples, 13 respondents agrees that they dismiss their employees followed by financial loss caused by corona.
- 12. 83.3% of respondents got financial assistance from government.
- 13. Majority of the respondents express their opinion that they fully or partially agreed financial crisis caused by corona affect their mental health also.

### 7. Conclusion

Business plays a major role within our society. Each type of business activity has its own relevance. The study on "impact of covid 19 on light and sound and hire goods owners helped to understand the whole area of their work and their life in detail. The study showed the satisfaction level of workers in this field, problems faced by them and the adverse impact of covid 19 financially and mentally. Therefore, measures have to be taken from the part of government or their welfare association. If the suggestions given in the study are honestly implemented, the services provided by hire goods and light and sound sector can be improved considerably and standard of life of the workers also improved. Hence, I conclude my study hopefully that it is helpful for the society.
